
7th grade Science News 1






What's Happening in 7th grade Moth?

Explorer's Café at Clark Lane

Making connections through food ...

October 2023

Did you know that twice a month there is a breakfast café at Clark Lane Middle School hosted by our own students? Students enrolled in the Explorers Program and Explorers Elective transform the culinary room into The Explorers Café, a restaurant that serves a variety of breakfast dishes for teachers and special invited guests.

How did it begin? Five years ago, Miss Sullivan and Mr. Lloyd started running a coffee cart. Students would prepare and deliver coffee to teachers on Fridays. Then, Miss Sullivan and Mr. Lloyd applied for a grant from the state of Connecticut and received \$6,000 to turn their little coffee cart into a fully functional breakfast café complete with coffee pots, dishes, a square system, cooking utensils and all the other equipment needed to run a small restaurant. Students in the Explorer Program get to practice job skills by working a variety of jobs within the café including: chef, dishwasher, cashier, waitress and delivery person.

Money earned in the café is used to fund field trips within Waterford to learn about our community and to Stop & Shop where we purchase the food needed for the next café!

The café is now run by Miss Sullivan, Mr. Nemeth, Mr. Nevins and Mrs. Long, as well as their students. Great job!

Dans la classe de français

6th graders are just finishing up their first unit on Greetings and Salutations and after their first quiz, we'll begin talking about the geography of France and they'll learn about all the places around the world where French is spoken! Did you know there are twenty nine countries around the world where French is an official language?

7th graders are still working in Unit 1, which focuses on nouns and subject pronouns. They'll soon be learning how to conjugate regular -er verbs in French. Click the code and check out the song they'll learn to help them memorize the verb endings!

8th graders are reviewing regular -er verb conjugations and will be working on describing people using physical description vocabulary very soon. We've just been reviewing adjectives to describe personality traits. Ask them to describe themselves in French! Intelligent? Sérieux? Courageux? Créatif? Sportif?


A classe linguae latinae

6th graders have just finished a unit about the geography of the Roman empire and the provinces which have become our modern-day countries. We are now just beginning to look at a new list of vocab, and learning how sentences in Latin go together in preparation for a story we will be reading together in class.

7th graders have completed a short review of topics covered last year, such as vocabulary, geography, and the Roman provinces. We are now beginning a new unit in our story where students will begin to identify different parts of more complex sentences, such as direct objects and prepositional phrases. They will soon begin learning about the Roman villa.

8th graders have completed a review unit on parts of speech, and we are now beginning a unit on the Trojan War. We will soon also be revisiting the perfect and imperfect verb tenses in preparation for the stories to come.





7th graders are working on talking about activities they like and/or dislike to do. They will learn to ask friends about which activities the enjoy or prefer. As we navigate through this unit, students will learn about Hispanic people who have had a positive influence in the U.S.A. and the activities they like to do.

8th graders are learning about healthy and unhealthy lifestyle. They are exchanging information while expressing their opinion about food choices and healthy habits. Students are also exploring traditional foods in Spanish speaking countries such as 'Ropa Vieja', a traditional dish from Cuba.




